WHO MAY APPLY?

Adult students who are attending an institution that currently has an active Alpha Sigma Lambda chapter and who have achieved the following criteria (**Student may not have to be a member of the local Alpha Sigma Lambda chapter to apply):**

- Enrolled in an associate degree program and completed 12 semester hours (18 quarter hours) of graded coursework at your current institution. (Not including transfer hours, assessment hours, CLEP credit and the like and not including any courses in which the student is currently enrolled).
- Enrolled in a baccalaureate or post-baccalaureate degree program and completed 24 semester hours (36 quarter hours) of graded coursework at your current institution.(Not including transfer hours, assessment hours, CLEP credit and the like and not including any courses in which the student is currently enrolled).
- Achieved a grade point average of **3.2 on a 4.0 scale** on all work taken at this institution
- Has a financial need for assistance to complete their degree

INSTRUCTIONS:

- ✓ IMPORTANT: Please contact the chapter councilor at your institution for scholarship application submission deadlines. For contact information, visit the ASLHS on-line chapter directory, <u>https://alsiglam.org/chapter-directory/.</u>
- ✓ Application & Personal Statement Form The application must be signed by the applicant and submitted to the ASLHS chapter councilor for review. This form may be completed online and downloaded in order to share the documents with the chapter councilor at your institution via email.
- ✓ One Faculty Recommendation Form The faculty recommendation form is to be completed by a faculty member that has taught one or more classes that you have taken. This form is a fillable form that may be completed and saved in order to submit to the chapter councilor via their institutional email.
- ✓ The chapter councilor will verify the student's academic criteria through documentation available to them, and submit this information along with the scholarship application materials.

Missing items or materials submitted in other formats will result in disqualification

PRINCIPLES

- a. Scholarships will be made to adult students in continuing higher education based on scholarship, leadership, the clarity and content of their personal statement, strength of recommendation, and need.
- b. Funds will be disbursed to the student, made payable to the recipient and the University/College at the end of the scholarship process.
- c. Maximum award per individual will be determined each year.
- d. Each chapter may nominate and submit no more than two complete scholarship applications from the application pool.

Non-Discrimination Policy

No applicant will be denied eligibility for a Scholarship based on race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, national origin, disability unrelated to program performance, veteran status or genetic or family medical history.

Conflict of Interest Policy

No relative or member of the household of any Alpha Sigma Lambda Society Director or Member of the Selection Committee will be eligible for a Scholarship.

TIPS FOR FACULTY RECOMMENDATIONS

- Reach out to a faculty member who you recently took classes with. Remind them who you are- what grade you received, and anything else that may have stuck out (for example, the topic of your final paper or project, or if there were discussions, how frequently or early you posted).
- Mention a few things about yourself what your educational and professional goals are, what your other responsibilities are in addition to taking classes.
- Clarify that the recommendation is meant to portray the type of student you are- which a faculty member can usually speak to from your behavior in their course.
- ✓ Offer to provide additional information if the faculty member feels it would be useful.
- \checkmark Give the faculty a few weeks to complete the recommendation form...don't ask the week it is due.
- ✓ Ask a few faculty members for recommendations. So that if one or more don't feel comfortable giving one, you don't have to start the process over. It does not hurt to end up with more than one recommendation although only one will be submitted with the scholarship application.
- Remind the faculty that the recommendation can be sent via email to the chapter councilor using their faculty email address.
